Farm Rescue and RDO Equipment Co. Planting Hope for Farmers

In 2006 RDO Equipment Co. stepped forward to become the exclusive equipment sponsor of Farm Rescue. This North Dakota based non-profit organization plants and harvests crops for farm families who have been faced with an injury, illness or a natural disaster. Founded by Bill Gross, who grew up on a family farm outside of Cleveland, ND, the Farm Rescue volunteers head to the fields using modern John Deere equipment to quickly and efficiently provide assistance during a critical time. Together Farm Rescue and RDO Equipment Co. have helped over 230 families keep their operation in tact while they focused on healing and recovery.

The spring of 2013 started out as a challenging one for the volunteers of Farm Rescue. Due to wet field conditions, planting didn't start until the first week of May. Farm Rescue's field equipment consisted of three planting units: two 9560Rs with 60' 1890 no-till air seeders and a 8360 with a DB66 corn planter. Even though teams were forced to dodge rain clouds all spring, there were 29 farm families in four different states that had their crops planted by the non-profit mobile farming operation. Volunteers from WI, MN, KY, PA, NM, WA, IL, GA, ND, SD and IL have all given unselfishly of their time to operate RDO Equipment Co.-sponsored equipment this spring.

Bill Gross commented, "The RDO Equipment Co. team, from top management to the technicians in the field, provide top notch service. We couldn't help as many people as we do without the amazing support of RDO Equipment Co. This service does not end with the farm families that are assisted. It has a ripple effect that also benefits ag businesses and economy within the region. Thanks to the leadership of RDO Equipment Co., this action has benefits for the entire rural community."

Rodney Rebel from Richardton, ND has farmed all of his life. This is the first planting he's ever missed due to a life-changing accident. On his way to feed his cattle, he was rear-ended by a semi and left with a broken arm and pelvis along with other injuries. According to the first responders, he shouldn't have even survived. The lengthy recovery period put him on the sidelines while the Farm Rescue brigade rolled onto the farm with their RDO Equipment Co.-sponsored equipment to put in his 1200-acre wheat crop. Rodney is just one example of the many people who have been assisted by Farm Rescue this spring.

Ken Chyle from Auburn, KY was one of the volunteers who served on the planting crew this spring. "RDO Equipment Co. was super to work with. If we had a problem, they always walked us right through it. They never asked why we were doing something or made us feel intimidated by the equipment. If we needed onsite support, they were right there or talked us through any technological challenge. I planted 3-4000 acres using an 8360 and a DB66 planter and it was an excellent piece of equipment."
