Stories of Assistance

PAUL AND RENEE IVESDAL – Edmore, ND: The dedication and hard work required to sustain a family farm for more than a century is difficult to fathom, and the thought of having everything you've built come crashing down due to an unexpected illness can be terrifying. This was the reality for Paul and Renee Ivesdal in the spring of 2020, when Paul was diagnosed with COVID-19. After a lengthy hospital stay, with time spent on a ventilator and some long-lasting effects on his mobility, Paul found himself in the midst of planting season without a solution for completing his necessary work. The Ivesdals decided it was time to contact Farm Rescue. Volunteers and equipment arrived in late-May to ensure the family's wheat and canola crops would be planted in time. This allowed Paul to continue his recovery and prepare for the harvest ahead. "There was a lot of pride that was instilled when we were young to get this stuff done ourselves, but it's just humbling that there's an organization around to do this. Because Farm Rescue showed up, there will be another day," Paul said.

GREG AND KAREN STAATZ – Abilene, KS: There is no such thing as a convenient time for injury to occur, but when Greg Staatz sustained severe leg trauma at the outset of his 2020 wheat harvest, you could say it was less than ideal. Greg was tackling some fence work on his Abilene, KS farm when his leg became entangled in a post hole digging machine. With multiple breaks sustained and weeks of recovery ahead, he knew some help would be needed. Thanks to local John Deere dealer, PrairieLand Partners – who had recently teamed up with Farm Rescue to launch assistance operations in the state of Kansas – Greg became aware of the nonprofit's services. Soon after his application was submitted, Farm Rescue volunteers and equipment arrived at the Staatz farm to help bring in the family's wheat crop. Several PrairieLand employees also pitched in to support Farm Rescue's very first assistance case in the newly added state. "This put an ease on my mind, so there's light at the end of the tunnel. I'm relieved," Greg said.

JOEL AND KARMELL NEWMAN – Sawyer, ND: Farm Rescue is honored to provide assistance to family farms in the midst of major crises, with hopes they may extend their farming legacy for generations to come. This was the mission when operations first began in 2006, and it has remained unchanged throughout each milestone in the organization's history. In the summer of 2020, Farm Rescue reached another important benchmark by assisting its 700th farm family. The fourth-generation farm of Joel and Karmell Newman near Sawyer, ND was the site of this historic event. Joel had recently undergone liver and bile duct resection surgery, which required a recovery period of around two months. The timing of the surgery and rehabilitation greatly interfered with the Newmans' harvest operations and Farm Rescue volunteers were privileged to provide support during the family's busy wheat season. Joel continued his recovery and is anxious to return to the field in 2021. His son, Carter, also plans to continue operations as the fifth generation on the Newman farm. "The gratitude from our family to yours is beyond what we can express in words. All we can say is thank you," Joel said.

We had lots of people offering help but Emil and Kenneth showed up just when we needed them while others were still busy with their own planting. Again, thanks so much - we appreciate you!




